Voting

in the City of Platteville



Our goal is for each eligible voter to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted.

Voter Eligibility

To be eligible to vote, you must be:

- A United States citizen; and
- Age 18 or older by election day; and
- A resident of the City of Platteville at least 28 days before election day; and
- If convicted of a felony, finished serving sentence, including probation/parole.

Photo ID

Photo ID is required to vote in Wisconsin. The address on your photo ID does not have to be current. Acceptable photo ID in Wisconsin include:

- Wisconsin DL or WI ID expiring after 11/5/24
- U.S. Passport expiring after 11/5/24
- Military ID card expiring after 11/5/24
- Unexpired WI driver license / ID receipt
- ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin
- Wisconsin accredited university/college Voter ID with issuance date, signature, and expiration within 2 years of issuance
- Unexpired Veterans Affairs ID
- Certificate of naturalization issued within last 2 years

Voter Registration

Acceptable proof of residence (see below) is required to register to vote. There are many ways to register:

- Online at <u>myvote.wi.gov</u> (until the 3rd Wednesday before election day)
- At the City Clerk's office (until the Friday before election day)
- At your polling location on election day
- By mail to the City Clerk's office (must be received by the 3rd Wednesday before election day)

Proof of Residence

When registering to vote you will need one

of the following (either in paper or electronic format) showing your current name and current address:

- Unexpired WI Driver License/ID card
- Utility bill from the last 90 days (water, gas, electric, cable, internet, phone)
- Bank, credit union, or credit card statement
- Property tax bill or receipt
- Government document
- Paycheck/paystub
- Residential lease effective on election day (not for registering by mail)
- College fee statement from last 9 months, with student ID
- Care facility contract/intake document
- Affidavit on letterhead from a social service agency that is providing services to a homeless voter

Voting Absentee

In order to receive an absentee ballot, you must show or provide a copy of acceptable photo ID. Absentee ballots are kept sealed and secure until counted on election day.

You can request an absentee ballot from the City Clerk by making the request in writing, email, fax, or online at myvote.wi.gov. Requests must include your full name, address, and address you want your ballot mailed to (if different than regular address), date of birth, and for which election.

Remember to send a copy of acceptable photo ID along with your request.

Absentee ballots will be mailed to you.To return your voted ballot, seal it in the certificate envelope provided, and return via US Mail or drop it off at the City Clerk's office by election day.

Two weeks before election day you can apply for and vote your absentee ballot in-person in the City Clerk's office.
