PLATTEVILLE COMMON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS April 9, 2024

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Platteville was called to order by Council President Barbara Daus at 6:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

PRESENTATION

- A. 2023 Platteville Incubator Annual Report and Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities (CEC)—PBII Executive Director Kate Koziol presented the 2023 Platteville Incubator Annual Report and Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities (CEC).
- B. Platteville Public Library Update Library Director Jessie Lee-Jones presented an update on the Platteville Public Library and handed out the 2023 Platteville Public Library Annual Report.

CONSIDERATION OF CONSENT AGENDA

Motion carried 7-0 on a roll call vote.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS, OBSERVATIONS AND PETITIONS, if any.

Alderperson Bob Gates introduced the new Museum Director Cody Grabhorn.

Field Representative Molly Bohn 320 Monroe Street presented a legislative update on behalf of Congressman Van Orden. She spoke about his visits, achievements, and upcoming events.

REPORTS

A. Board/Commission/Committee Minutes – Water and Sewer Commission, Historic Preservation Commission, and Police and Fire Commission.

ACTION

A. Resolution – 2024-2026 Rountree Branch Streambank Repairs Grant – Motion by Kasper, second by Kilian to approve Resolution 24-02 committing to a local match of up to \$100,000 for streambank repairs at Sites 1, 2 and 3 as listed in the grant application. Bill and Dena Grutz, 4367 Jewell Lane, Tim Deis, 115 Moonlight Drive, and Dave Carnahan, 4951 US Hwy 151 registered in favor; Bob Hundhausen, 1043 Woodland Road spoke in favor and read statements from Gene Weber, 1285 Union Street and Chamber Director Wayne Wodarz, 1380 N 4th Street. Motion carried on a 7 to 0 roll call vote.

- B. Contract 1-24 Sowden & Grace Street Reconstruction Motion by Kopp, second by Kasper to award Contract 1-24, Sowden and Grace Street Reconstruction to H James and Sons at the Bid Price of \$914,617.75. Motion carried on a 7 to 0 roll call vote.
- C. Budget Considerations for Savings on Sowden & Grace Motion by Gates, second by Kopp to direct Staff to design and bid the reconstruction of North Court Street from Adams to Lewis Street and install concrete on Lewis Street where the fire trucks will return to the Fire Facility. Motion carried on a 7 to 0 roll call vote.
- D. 2023 Budget Carryovers to 2024, Budget Amendment #1 Motion by Kopp, second by Kasper to approve the carryover of \$1,148,796 in the CIP Fund and \$74,207 in the General Fund per the attached schedules. Motion carried on a 7 to 0 roll call vote.

INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION

A. Resolution DNR Land Acquisition Grant Application - Eastside Trail Extension - Community Development Director Joe Carroll explained that The Platteville Community Arboretum (PCA) is working on a plan for an expansion of the existing Rountree Branch Trail that would connect Business Highway 151 to Eastside Road. They are also looking at acquiring a parcel of land along Valley Road that would be used for parking and a trail access point. This parking area would be intended to replace the access and parking area adjacent to the quarry driveway north of Mineral Street. There have been a few near misses with vehicles using this area and trucks entering and exiting the quarry, so relocating the trail parking and access point would eliminate this problem. The project would include an application for a DNR land acquisition grant, which would provide up to 50% of the project costs. The city would be the applicant for the grant on behalf of the PCA, and all lands acquired with the grant would be turned over to the City. The Council must approve a resolution authorizing submittal of the grant application. Joe Jacquinot, President of the PCA asked the Council to consider three questions: Should the City apply for the grant to acquire the land that would connect Business Highway 151 and Eastside Road, should Valley Road be added, and how much funding would the City be willing to provide?

WORK SESSION

TIDE - Inclusion, Diversity, And Equity Initiatives – City Manager Langreck asked that the work session focus on the three specific elements: DEI initiatives as outlined in Appendix A of the Resolution, creation of a permanent DEI Committee, and amending the City's DEI Statement (replacement of "Taskforce" with "DEI Committee"). He also explained the progression of the work session to be: Establish rules of discussion and public comment (delivered by the Council President), define the scope of discussion (focus on three elements above), allow community comments and observations related to the specific topics (limited allotment of time), City Manager vision for implementing the proposed initiatives, and Council member discussion. During the public comment time Vicky Suhr, 200 N Elm Street and Nathan Robinson, 87 E Main Street registered in favor; Rosalyn Broussard, 65 Mitchell Avenue and Bev Johansen, 170 Preston Drive spoke for informational purposes; Emily Zachary, 60 Ann Street and Royal Palmer, 127 E Main Street spoke in favor; Bob Brodbeck, 55 Preston Drive spoke against.

Motion by Artz, seconded by Kasper to go into a Closed Session. Motion carried 7-0 on a roll call vote.

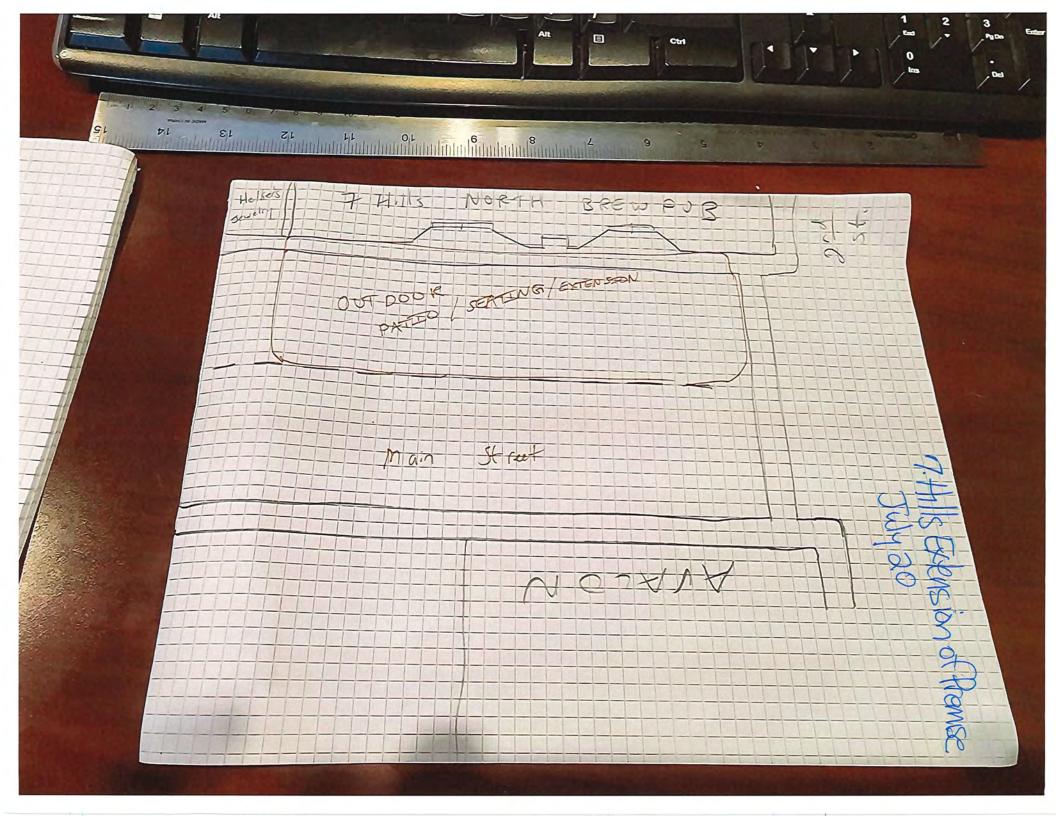

VARIANCE REQUEST:

1035 Oakhaven Court - Mark and Amanda Witzig

Carroll introduced the variance request from Mark and Amanda Witzig who seek a variance regarding the setback of an existing deck stairs and building addition.

Mark and Amanda Witzig own and reside on the property at 1035 Oakhaven Court. They purchased the property in 2021. Randy and Dawn Jenny are in the process of constructing a home on the adjacent property at 185 W. Knollwood Way. They purchased their property sometime after 2021 when it was two vacant lots (155 and 185 W. Knollwood Way).

In November of 2023 a Certified Survey Map (CSM) was created to combine the two Jenny parcels into the current lot. The CSM provided information to indicate that a patio and deck located on the Witzig property extend across the property line onto the Jenny property. The patio, deck and a storage addition located under the deck were constructed by the previous owner sometime between 2015 and 2020 and were in existence at the time the Witzig's purchased the property. The deck improvements were made without a building permit and were constructed in violation of the zoning ordinance. The deck and storage addition located under the deck do not meet the required side-yard setback. The deck extends 1.4 feet onto the Jenny property. The Witzigs are proposing to remove a portion of the deck and are seeking a variance for the remaining deck stairs and building addition that do not conform to the required side-yard setback.

To achieve compliance with the zoning ordinance, the applicant is proposing to remove a portion of the deck so that it will be even with the back of the house and will no longer encroach onto the adjacent Jenny property. The remaining portion of the deck will meet the required setback, but they would like to keep the deck stairs, which will be closer than the required 5 feet. They would also like to keep the basement storage addition that is located under the deck. The variance request will be for the location of the deck stairs within the 5' setback (approximately 2.5 feet), and the location of the storage addition within the 10' setback (approximately 5.5 feet). No changes are proposed for the patio.

From a legal perspective there is some question if the applicable standards have been met, but Staff believes a variance is warranted. If the Board agrees, the variance should be approved.

Applicant statement.

Mark Witzig provided more information regarding the request. They have begun talking to contractors regarding the removal of a portion of the deck. They would like to maintain the stairs to maintain access from the ground to the deck, but if needed the stairs could be removed. He informed the Board that they were not aware of the encroachment when they purchased the property and were fortunate to notice the patio encroachment right before the closing. The easement was drafted at the last minute after they noticed the location of the patio, but since the deck was not known to be an issue, that was not included in the easement.

After a question from the Board, he described the attempts to resolve the issue with the adjacent property owners, but no agreement was reached.

Public statements in favor. None

Public statements against.

Dawn Jenny spoke against the request as the owner of the adjacent property where the current encroachment exists. They would like to have all the improvements that were installed illegally be removed and brought into compliance with the zoning requirements. The improvements were installed without a building permit and in violation of the ordinance, so they shouldn't be allowed to remain.

She provided some information regarding the attempts between them and the Witzig's and City staff to find a resolution to the issue, but the two property owners couldn't come to an agreement.

Public statements in general. None

Applicant Rebuttal. None

Board Discussion.

The Board discussed the matter and questioned the owners regarding possibilities to find a resolution to the problem. The Board recognizes that the problem was created by the previous property owner and both of the current owners are not responsible for the issue and are victims of the situation. They appreciate the Witzig's decision to move forward with removing part of the deck in an attempt to improve the situation. Consensus of the Board is that the variance request is reasonable and seems to be a good solution to an unusual problem.

Motion by Kasper to approve the variance. Second by Niehaus. Motion was approved 5-0.

The Findings of Fact

The Witzigs face an unnecessary burden due to the potential loss of the deck, stairs, and storage room based on a situation they didn't create.

The improvements have been there for several years and have not previously been an issue for the neighborhood.

This is a unique situation because the violation was created by the previous owner without knowledge of the City or either of the current owners.

450 N. Court Street - Platteville Fire Department

Carroll introduced the variance request from the Platteville Fire Department who seeks a variance regarding the side yard setback for the proposed new fire station.

In 2021 the City acquired the former OE Gray School property from the Platteville School District. The Council has identified this property as the future location of a new fire station. The existing school building will be demolished and replaced with a new building. Several options to locate the building on this site have been investigated to determine the best building and site layout. Acquisition of additional property at 220 W. Adams Street is also being pursued to provide adequate space and access.

The new building is being proposed to replace the current fire station located at 275 E. Main Street. The current building is outdated in many respects but has a primary issue with lack of space for the trucks and also lack of space for the administration and support activities. The proposed building will include an apparatus bay area, equipment storage, and areas for decontamination, gear cleaning, communication, offices, and a large training/community space — all on the main floor. The exterior site improvements will include parking for personnel when responding to fires, public parking for the community room, a stormwater detention area, exterior training space, and the exit and entrance drives for the apparatus bay. The property has frontage on Adams Street, Court Street, Lewis Street and Elm Street. The property slopes from the southeast corner to the northwest corner, with the flattest portion of the lot being to the east and south.

The building is still in the final design stage, so some modifications may yet occur. However, as proposed, the building will be 6'-1" from the nearest lot line along the western interior boundary of the property. Section 22.054(E) of the Zoning Ordinance requires a minimum side-yard setback of 15 feet, with a greater setback required for taller buildings (1 foot for each foot of building height). The height of the building at that location is currently 25'-4", which requires a setback of 25'-4". The designers are working on some modifications that will reduce the building width (approximately 4') and resulting setback, and that will reduce the building height (approximately 2'), which will reduce the required setback. Based on these potential changes, the current plan should be considered the worst-case scenario. The proposed setback of 6'-1" does not meet the required setback, so the Fire Department is requesting a variance to allow the closer setback.

Applicant statement.

Chief Simmons was available to answer any questions the Board my have.

Public statements in favor. None

Public statements against. None

Public statements in general. None

Applicant Rebuttal. Carroll mentioned that all the nearby property owners were notified of the request, but none have come forward to make any comments either for or against the request.

Board Discussion.

The Board recognized the need to have the building located where it is proposed. Since none of the neighbors have come forward to express any concerns, it appears that there are not impacts that need to be considered.

Motion by Weber to approve the variance. Second by Lynch. Motion was approved 5-0.

The Findings of Fact

The variance is necessary to locate the building where proper fire truck access can be provided.

No concerns have been expressed by the neighbors, so there must not be any significant public impact.

The project is necessary for the benefit of the community.

ITEM NUMBER:

The Platteville Community Arboretum (PCA) is working on a plan for an expansion of the existing Rountree Branch Trail that would connect Business Highway 151 to Eastside Road. They are also looking at acquiring a parcel of land along Valley Road that would be used for parking and a trail access point. This parking area would be intended to replace the access and parking area adjacent to the guarry driveway north of Mineral Street. There have been a few near misses with vehicles using this area and trucks entering and exiting the quarry, so relocating the trail parking and access point would eliminate this problem.

The project would include an application for a DNR land acquisition grant, which would provide up to 50% of the project costs. The city would be the applicant for the grant on behalf of the PCA, and all lands acquired with the grant would be turned over to the City. The Council must approve a resolution authorizing submittal of the grant application.

Budget/Fiscal Impact:

The grant requires a local funding match. The matching funds will be obtained by the Platteville Community Arboretum through donations, but they would also like the City to provide some financial assistance (approximately \$30,000).

Recommendation:

The Plan Commission recommended the Council proceed with the grant application.

Staff recommends approval of the request to submit an application to the DNR Land Acquisition Grant program for the trail extension and approval of the required resolution.

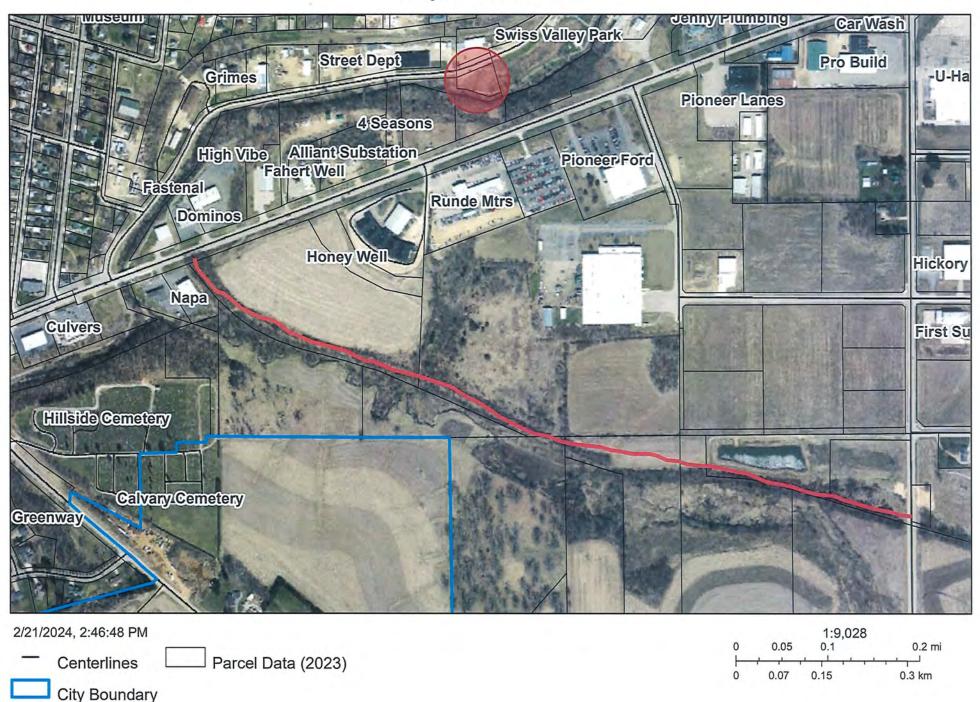

Description:

On January 31, 2024 the attached claim for unlawful tax was submitted to the City via email. Also on January 31, 2024 a partial payment of \$9,073.03 was made for parcel #271-00377-0040, address 500 E. Business Highway 151 owned by Grant County Humane Society Inc (GCHS).

On January 31, 2024 staff submitted the claim to the city attorney for review and response.

Key takeaways from the Axley memorandum:

- Per Wis. Stat. § 70.11(28), "Property owned and operated by a humane society.... for the care and shelter of homeless animals on a nonprofit basis" is exempt from property taxes.
- The property was not tax exempt when GCHS purchased it. Because GCHS closed on the Property after March 1, GCHS was not eligible to file for a property tax exemption in 2024.
- Wis. Stat. § 74.35(5)(c) requires a claimant to pay the taxes owed timely and fully as a condition precedent to bringing a claim.
- GCHS has failed to timely pay the taxes on the Property and, as of the date of the memorandum, owed \$16,535.01, plus interest. Therefore, GCHS failed to meet the statutory prerequisite for its recovery of unlawful taxes claim.

Budget/Fiscal Impact:

Denial of the claim would mean GCHS remains responsible for payment of the outstanding property taxes plus any penalties and interest due.

If the Council allowed the claim, the other taxing jurisdictions may request reimbursement by the city for their portion of the unpaid taxes since Wis. Stat. § 74.35(5)(c) states that "No claim may be filed or maintained under this section unless the tax for which the claim is filed, or any authorized installment payment of the tax, is timely paid".

Recommendation:

City Attorney recommendation is for denial of the claim.

Sample Affirmative Motion:

"Motion to deny the claim of unlawful tax by Grant County Humane Society Inc per Wis. Stat. § 74.35(5)(c) which states that no claim may be maintained unless the tax for which the claim is filed is timely paid".

Dear Concerned parties,

We received a \$16,000 property tax bill in the mail recently. After the initial shock we obtained information that we needed to process paperwork to obtain a waiver based on being a 501(c)3.

This paperwork was due March 31, 2023. We did not close, nor had any idea we were purchasing the building, at that time. We could not have processed the paperwork in time to get the taxes waived. We closed on the building May 19th 2023.

Prior to our purchase we spent months visiting with the Platteville municipality to obtain a conditional use permit. During those meetings we were able to take questions from numerous committee and city council individuals. Quite often the conversation went to the loss of tax revenue selling to a nonprofit would necessitate. The three groups of the Georgina Freudenreich Committee, the Planning Committee, the General City Counsel as well as the municipal administration understood that the taxes for this building would be waived. At no time, during these many meetings did any of these entities indicate that we needed to ask for a waiver by a certain date or in writing.

We are asking the municipality and the city to accept this as a request to waive the property tax payment for 500 E. 151 Platteville WI for the year 2023. I am writing this letter as indicated under Sec 74.35 of th Wis Stats section 2.

2024 Guide for Property Owners

D. Unlawful tax claim

1. Sec. <u>74.35</u>, Wis. Stats. provides for the recovery of unlawful taxes under very specific conditions. An unlawful tax occurs when one or more of the following errors are made:

- Clerical error made in the property description or in the tax calculation
- · Assessment included real property improvements that did not exist on the January 1 assessment date
- Property was exempt from taxation
- Property was not located in the municipality
- · Double assessment was made
- · Arithmetic, transpositional or similar error occurred

Note: An unlawful tax does not include judgment questions about the valuation. The subjective valuation issues must be addressed through the BOR appeal process.

2. You can recover unlawful taxes under state law (sec. <u>74.35</u>, Wis. Stats.), by filing a claim with your municipality. The claim must:

- · Be in writing
- State the alleged circumstances for the claim
- · State the amount of the claim
- Be signed by the claimant or the claimant's agent
- Be served to the municipal clerk

A claim for the recovery of unlawful taxes paid to the wrong municipality must be filed within two years after the last date specified for timely payment of the tax. All other claims for recovery of unlawful taxes must be filed by January 31 of the year the tax is payable. No claim may be made unless the tax, or any authorized payment of the tax, is timely paid.

If the municipality approves the claim, payment must be made within 90 days after the claim is allowed.

E. Excessive assessment claim

Under state law (sec. <u>74.37</u>, Wis. Stats.), you may file a claim to recover the amount of general property tax imposed because the property assessment was excessive.

To file a claim on excessive assessment, you must first appeal to the BOR (unless notice under sec. <u>70.365</u>, Wis. Stats., was not given). You must file the claim with the municipality by January 31 of the year the tax is payable under sec. <u>74.35</u> or <u>74.37</u>, Wis. Stats.

Claim must:

- · Be in writing
- State the alleged circumstances for the claim
- State the amount of the claim
- Be signed by the claimant or the claimant's agent
- Be served to the municipal clerk

You cannot file a claim on excessive assessment if you appealed the BOR's determination to DOR or to circuit court. No claim may be made unless the tax is timely paid under state law (sec. <u>74.35</u> or <u>74.37</u>, Wis. Stats.).

If the municipality approves the claim, payment must be made within 90 days after the claim is allowed.

- (2) Subsequent settlements. On or before the 15th day of each month following the month in which an installment payment of real property taxes is required by the ordinance, the taxation district treasurer shall do all of the following:
- (a) Pay to the proper treasurer all collections of delinquent special assessments, special charges and special taxes not previously settled for, as directed by sub. (1) (a) to (h).
- (b) Pay to each taxing jurisdiction within the district its proportionate share of real property taxes collected, except that the taxation district treasurer shall pay the state's proportionate share to the county, and the county treasurer shall settle for that share under s. 74.29. As part of that distribution, the taxation district treasurer shall retain for the taxation district and for each tax incremental district within the taxation district and each environmental remediation tax incremental district created by the taxation district its proportionate share of real property taxes. The taxation district treasurer shall also distribute to the county the proportionate share of real property taxes for each environmental remediation tax incremental district created by the county.
- (c) Pay to each taxing jurisdiction within the district its proportionate share of taxes on improvements on leased land, except that the treasurer shall pay the state's proportionate share to the county. As part of that distribution, the taxation district treasurer shall allocate to each tax incremental district within the taxation district its proportionate share of taxes on improvements on leased land.
- (3) APPROVAL OF PAYMENT NOT REQUIRED. The taxation district treasurer shall make payments required under subs. (1) and (2) whether or not the governing body of the taxation district has approved those payments. Following a payment required under subs. (1) and (2), the taxation district treasurer shall prepare and transmit a voucher for that payment to the governing body of the taxation district.

- 74.31 Failure to settle timely. If the taxation district treasurer or county treasurer does not settle as required under ss. 74.23 to 74.30:
- (1) Interest Charge. The taxation district or county which has not settled shall pay 12 percent annual interest on the amount not timely paid to the taxing jurisdiction, including this state, to which money is due, calculated from the date settlement was required.
- (2) PENALTY. The taxing jurisdiction, including this state, to which money is due may demand, in writing, payment from the taxation district or county which has not settled. If, within 3 days after receipt of a written demand, settlement is not made, the taxation district or county shall pay the taxing jurisdiction, including this state, making the demand a 5 percent penalty on the amount remaining unpaid.

- 74.315 Omitted property. (1) SUBMISSION. No later than October 1 of each year, the taxation district clerk shall submit to the department of revenue, on a form prescribed by the department, a listing of all the omitted taxes under s. 70.44 to be included on the taxation district's next tax roll, if the total of all such taxes exceeds \$5,000.
- (2) EQUALIZED VALUATION. After receiving the form under sub. (1), but no later than November 15, the department of revenue shall determine the amount of any change in the taxation district's equalized valuation that results from considering the valuation represented by the taxes described under sub. (1). The department's determination under this subsection is subject to review only under s. 227.53.
- (3) NOTICE AND DISTRIBUTION. If the department of revenue determines under sub. (2) that the taxation district's equalized valuation changed as a result of considering the valuation represented by the taxes described under sub. (1), the department shall notify

the taxation district and the taxation district shall distribute the resulting collections under ss. 74.23 (1) (a) 5., 74.25 (1) (a) 4m., and 74.30 (1) (dm).

SUBCHAPTER V

ADJUSTMENT

- 74.33 Sharing and charging back of taxes due to pal**pable errors.** (1) Grounds. After the tax roll has been delivered to the treasurer of the taxation district under s. 74.03, the governing body of the taxation district may refund or rescind in whole or in part any general property tax shown in the tax roll, including agreed-upon interest, if:
- (a) A clerical error has been made in the description of the property or in the computation of the tax.
- (b) The assessment included real property improvements which did not exist on the date under s. 70.10 for making the assessment.
- (c) The property is exempt by law from taxation, except as provided under sub. (2).
- (d) The property is not located in the taxation district for which the tax roll was prepared.
 - (e) A double assessment has been made.
 - (f) An arithmetic, transpositional or similar error has occurred.
- (2) EXCEPTIONS. The governing body of a taxation district may not refund or rescind any tax under this section if the alleged error may be appealed under s. 70.995 (8) (c) or if the alleged error is solely that the assessor placed a valuation on the property that is excessive.
- (3) CHARGING BACK AND SHARING TAXES. If an error under sub. (1) has been discovered, the governing body of the taxation district shall proceed under s. 74.41.

- 74.35 Recovery of unlawful taxes. (1) Definitions. In this section "unlawful tax" means a general property tax with respect to which one or more errors specified in s. 74.33 (1) (a) to (f) were made. "Unlawful tax" does not include a tax in respect to which the alleged defect is solely that the assessor placed a valuation on the property that is excessive.
- (2) CLAIM AGAINST TAXATION DISTRICT. (a) A person aggrieved by the levy and collection of an unlawful tax assessed against his or her property may file a claim to recover the unlawful tax against the taxation district which collected the tax.
- (b) A claim filed under this section shall meet all of the following conditions:
 - 1. Be in writing.
- 2. State the alleged circumstances giving rise to the claim, including the basis for the claim as specified in s. 74.33 (1) (a) to
 - 3. State as accurately as possible the amount of the claim.
 - 4. Be signed by the claimant or his or her agent.
- 5. Be served on the clerk of the taxation district in the manner prescribed in s. 801.11 (4).
- (2m) EXCLUSIVE PROCEDURE. A claim that property is exempt, other than a claim that property is exempt under s. 70.11 (21) or (27), may be made only in an action under this section. Such a claim may not be made by means of an action under s. 74.33 or an action for a declaratory judgment under s. 806.04.
- (3) ACTION ON CLAIM. (a) In this subsection, to "disallow" a claim means either to deny the claim in whole or in part or to fail

to take final action on the claim within 90 days after the claim is

PROPERTY TAX COLLECTION

- (b) The taxation district shall notify the claimant by certified or registered mail whether the claim is allowed or disallowed within 90 days after the claim is filed.
- (c) If the governing body of the taxation district determines that an unlawful tax has been paid and that the claim for recovery of the unlawful tax has complied with all legal requirements, the governing body shall allow the claim. The taxation district treasurer shall pay the claim not later than 90 days after the claim is allowed.
- (d) If the taxation district disallows the claim, the claimant may commence an action in circuit court to recover the amount of the claim not allowed. The action shall be commenced within 90 days after the claimant receives notice by certified or registered mail that the claim is disallowed.
- (4) INTEREST. The amount of a claim filed under sub. (2) or an action commenced under sub. (3) may include interest computed from the date of filing the claim against the taxation district, at the rate of 0.8 percent per month.
- (5) LIMITATIONS ON BRINGING CLAIMS. (a) Except as provided under par. (b), a claim under this section shall be filed by January 31 of the year in which the tax is payable.
- (b) A claim under this section for recovery of taxes paid to the wrong taxation district shall be filed within 2 years after the last date specified for timely payment of the tax under s. 74.11, 74.12 or 74.87.
- (c) No claim may be filed or maintained under this section unless the tax for which the claim is filed, or any authorized installment payment of the tax, is timely paid under s. 74.11, 74.12 or 74.87.
- (d) No claim may be made under this section based on the contention that the tax was unlawful because the property is exempt from taxation under s. 70.11 (21) or (27).
- (6) COMPENSATION FOR TAXATION DISTRICT. If taxes are refunded under sub. (3), the governing body of the taxation district may proceed under s. 74.41.

This section only authorizes courts to determine whether a taxpayer is exempt from taxes already paid, not taxes that might be assessed in the future. Tax exempt status, once granted, is not automatic. It is subject to continuing review, a notion inconsistent with a declaration that property is exempt from future property taxes. Northwest Wisconsin Community Services Agency, Inc. v. City of Montreal, 2010 WI App 119, 328 Wis. 2d 760, 789 N.W.2d 392, 09–2568.

- 74.37 Claim on excessive assessment. (1) Definition. In this section, a "claim for an excessive assessment" or an "action for an excessive assessment" means a claim or action, respectively, by an aggrieved person to recover that amount of general property tax imposed because the assessment of property was excessive.
- (2) CLAIM. (a) A claim for an excessive assessment may be filed against the taxation district, or the county that has a county assessor system, which collected the tax.
- (b) A claim filed under this section shall meet all of the following conditions:
 - 1. Be in writing.
 - 2. State the alleged circumstances giving rise to the claim.
 - 3. State as accurately as possible the amount of the claim.
 - 4. Be signed by the claimant or his or her agent.
- 5. Be served on the clerk of the taxation district, or the clerk of the county that has a county assessor system, in the manner prescribed in s. 801.11 (4) by January 31 of the year in which the tax based upon the contested assessment is payable.
- (3) ACTION ON CLAIM. (a) In this subsection, to "disallow" a claim means either to deny the claim in whole or in part or to fail to take final action on the claim within 90 days after the claim is

- (b) The taxation district or county that has a county assessor system shall notify the claimant by certified or registered mail whether the claim is allowed or disallowed within 90 days after the claim is filed.
- (c) If the governing body of the taxation district or county that has a county assessor system determines that a tax has been paid which was based on an excessive assessment, and that the claim for an excessive assessment has complied with all legal requirements, the governing body shall allow the claim. The taxation district or county treasurer shall pay the claim not later than 90 days after the claim is allowed.
- (d) If the taxation district or county disallows the claim, the claimant may commence an action in circuit court to recover the amount of the claim not allowed. The action shall be commenced within 90 days after the claimant receives notice by registered or certified mail that the claim is disallowed.
- (4) CONDITIONS. (a) No claim or action for an excessive assessment may be brought under this section unless the procedures for objecting to assessments under s. 70.47, except under s. 70.47 (13), have been complied with. This paragraph does not apply if notice under s. 70.365 was not given.
- (b) No claim or action for an excessive assessment may be brought or maintained under this section unless the tax for which the claim is filed, or any authorized installment of the tax, is timely paid under s. 74.11 or 74.12.
- (c) No claim or action for an excessive assessment may be brought or maintained under this section if the assessment of the property for the same year is contested under s. 70.47 (7) (c), (13), or (16) (c) or 70.85. No assessment may be contested under s. 70.47 (7) (c), (13), or (16) (c) or 70.85 if a claim is brought and maintained under this section based on the same assessment.

NOTE: The supreme court in Metropolitan Associates v. City of Milwaukee, 2011 WI 20, held the amendment of par. (c) by 2007 Wis. Act 86 to be unconstitutional and severed from the remainder of the statute. Prior to the amendment by Act 86, par. (c) read:

- (c) No claim or action for an excessive assessment may be brought or maintained under this section if the assessment of the property for the same year is contested under s. 70.47 (13) or 70.85. No assessment may be contested under s. 70.47 (13) or 70.85 if a claim is brought and maintained under this section based on the same assessment.
- (d) No claim or action for an excessive assessment may be brought or maintained under this section if the taxation district in which the property is located enacts an ordinance under s. 70.47 (7) (c) or if the 1st class city in which the property is located enacts an ordinance under s. 70.47 (16) (c), except that this paragraph does not apply if the taxation district or the 1st class city did not comply with s. 70.365.

NOTE: The supreme court in Metropolitan Associates v. City of Milwaukee, 2011 WI 20, held the creation of par. (d) by 2007 Wis. Act 86 to be unconstitutional and severed from the remainder of the statute.

- (5) Interest. The amount of a claim filed under sub. (2) or an action commenced under sub. (3) may include interest at the average annual discount rate determined by the last auction of 6-month U.S. treasury bills before the objection per day for the period of time between the time when the tax was due and the date that the claim was paid.
- **(6)** EXCEPTION. This section does not apply in counties with a population of 500,000 or more.

NOTE: The supreme court in Nankin v. Village of Shorewood, 2001 WI 92, 245 Wis. 2d 86, 630 N.W.2d 141, held sub. (6) to be unconstitutional and severed from the remainder of the statute.

(7) COMPENSATION. If taxes are refunded under sub. (3), the governing body of the taxation district or county that has a county assessor system may proceed under s. 74.41.

Sections 70.47 (13), 70.85, and 74.37 provide the exclusive method to challenge a municipality's bases for assessment of individual parcels. All require appeal to the board of review prior to court action. There is no alternative procedure to challenge an assessment's compliance with the uniformity clause. Hermann v. Town of Delavan, 215 Wis. 2d 370, 572 N.W.2d 855 (1998), 96-0171.

Sub. (6) is unconstitutional and severed from the remainder of the section. Nankin v. Village of Shorewood, 2001 WI 92, 245 Wis. 2d 86, 630 N.W.2d 141, 99-1058.
