- 4. Citizen Comments, Observations, & Petitions: Concerns about the Stop sign on Elmer at Court. There are concerns about visibility and whether the orange flags should be replaced.

5. Old Business:

- a. TID 5 Sidewalk: The contract was awarded to Owen's Excavating. This will be a late summer/early fall project.
- b. STARS Grant: Howard stated the paperwork for the DOT will be going to the Common Council for approval on May 23.
- c. TAP Planning Grant: Troy Maggied and Austin Coppernoll spoke with Committee members and received guidance from the members on the planning process. Troy said there is a person hired to do this planning who will be starting in June. There will be an update to the Safe Routes to Schools. The plan will be data driven and have an opportunity for public input. One comment from Committee members was to see the possibility of island refuges in the Lancaster Street crossing at Camp Street. Due to the skew, the distance to cross Lancaster Street is very long and with the traffic there, it might be best to have a refuge island.
