1. Call to Order at 6:00 pm by Howard Crofoot.

- 2. Election of Chairperson: Motion by Eileen, Second by Danica to elect Robin Fatzinger as Chairperson. Motion approved unanimously. Robin assumed the duties of Chairperson.
- 3. Approval of Minutes: May 20, 2024 CSRC: Motion to approve by Danica, second by Paul. Motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Citizen Comments, Observations, & Petitions: Paul thanked the City for completing the sealcoating on the PCA trail and asked that the City consider the trail on Eastside Road for 2025.
- 5. Old Business:
  - a. Follow Up on Bike & Pedestrian Plan.

The plan was accepted by the Common Council on May 28.

- b. Bike and Pedestrian Plan: Howard confirmed that he will propose CIP funding for Top 8 items – 7, 3, 5 and 6 in priority order.
  - 7. Extend the sidewalk along Southwest Road from UWP Lot 28 to Southwest Lane
  - 3. Add a Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at Lancaster Street and Camp Street
    - 5. Add a crosswalk and RRFB at Water Street and Lewis Street
  - 6. Complete the sidewalk on Hickory Street from Cedar to Camp

### 8. New Business:

- a. Bike and Pedestrian "Short Term" items:
  - C.15. Discourage the use of bicycles on sidewalks downtown. Add signs prohibiting riding on sidewalks from Elm to Water and from Furnace to Pine.
  - There was discussion about possible strategies. One was signage in the Downtown, including on the LED signs. Another was to contact the UW-P Cycling Club to see if they would help educate students.
  - C.16. Extend the downtown 15mph zone past the library to improve safety, particularly with the new bus stop
  - There was discussion about this item. Howard said it could be done, but it would be difficult to enforce and drivers would likely accelerate as they are heading west regardless of signs. There was discussion of "when children are present", to address concerns about the school bus stop.
  - C.17. Add leading pedestrian intervals and walking countdowns at busy intersections with traffic signals. Consider making walk signs automatic (with the countdown) and implementing no right turn on red
  - Howard explained that the countdown timers can be implemented at a cost of about \$5,000 per intersection. There was a suggestion to wait until the signals need replacing before implementing this. Making walk signs automatic would create delays for vehicle traffic when pedestrians are not crossing. There was a suggestion to investigate whether the cycles would accommodate automatic pedestrian cycles during the morning and afternoon peak times when the signals at Chestnut & Pine and Chestnut & Main are synchronized. No Right Turn on Red. There was discussion and consensus was to table and revisit later due to impacts on traffic.
  - C.22. Ensure that stoplights can be triggered by bicycles, particularly along bike routes.
  - Howard explained how the traffic loops work and that there is a balance of sensitivity to detection and oversensitive where the loops sense vehicles in the opposing lanes and work inefficiently. Some loops were able to be attuned, such as the westbound lane on Pine at Chestnut. If a bicyclist is

approximately 2 feet inside the double-yellow centerline and close to the stop bar, it can trigger the signal. This is also better addressed in the future when replacing the signals. Newer signals use video technology to determine traffic waiting at signals and can be programmed to accept bicycle traffic as a cue to change signals.

- C.23. Ensure that the length of walk signs is long enough for low mobility pedestrians.
- Done. Howard explained how walk signals work. The white crossing is about 7 seconds long (on Chestnut Street) and is the interval to allow pedestrians to start crossing. The Flashing Orange interval is meant to tell pedestrians who have not entered the intersection, to wait, but those in the intersection can complete the movement. Engineering standards allow for low mobility pedestrians to complete the crossing at an assumed pace of 2.5 feet per second during this phase (14 seconds to cross Chestnut Street).

The following items were not discussed due to time available. Motion by Tom, Second by Danica to Table discussion until the July meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

- C.24. Develop a schedule for repainting crosswalks and seal coating trails and sidepaths. The years of previous and future painting and sealcoating should be maintained. City staff should continue annual repainting of crosswalks. Epoxy should be reapplied to highway crosswalks every five years or as funding allows.

- C.35. Consider strategies to improve visibility at intersections, such as: a. Evaluate ways to enforce the city ordinance on vision clearance at intersections (22.09.a). This includes fences and landscaping. b. Remove parking stalls near crosswalks, particularly on roads surrounding UWP (Ullsvik Hall and intersection of Greenwood and Longhorn).

On September 7, 2021, I, Officer Coree Lee, was working as a police officer for the Platteville Police Department within the City of Platteville, County of Grant, State of Wisconsin. I was wearing my full duty uniform and operating a fully marked squad car.
At 2:43 p.m., I was at Community First Bank for a different incident, when I was informed of an accident involving a truck and a motorized bicycle. I was informed the accident occurred at the intersection of Main St. and Chestnut St. I radioed this information to Sergeant Paul Rehlinger and left the business. I activated my body camera and made contact with the involved individuals. I observed the occupant of the motorized bicycle, identified by WI DL as a large part of the motorized bicycle, it is a proposed by a witness, verbally identified as said no, he are a said the truck turned left at the intersection and hit the bicyclist, who was going straight through the intersection.
At this time, Sgt. Rehlinger arrived on scene and spoke to I spoke to the driver of the truck, identified by Guatemala ID as Reyez Chuy Godiez. I asked Reyez what happened. Reyez said he did not speak English and he called a friend to assist with translating. Reyez said he turned left at the intersection on the bicyclist drove into his truck. I asked Reyez if he had a driver's license or insurance. Reyez answered no. I advised Reyez not to drive without a license. I took pictures of the truck and observed the truck had minor damage to the front, passenger's side. I informed Reyez he would be mailed citations for Operate without Valid License (1st Violation) and Operate Motor Vehicle without Insurance.
I made contact with who was being evaluated by EMTs. I took a picture of injury and advised Reyest did not have insurance. The EMTs cleaned wound and he signed a refusal form. Sgt. Rehlinger took pictures of bicycle. A DT4000 was completed.

On September 5, 2023, I, Officer Coree Lee, was working as a police officer for the Platteville Police Department

within the City of Platteville, County of Grant, State of Wisconsin. I was wearing my full duty uniform and operating a fully marked squad car. At 3:13 p.m., I was flagged down by a driver who advised a pedestrian was struck by a Jeep in the area of Chestnut St. and Main St. The driver advised he thought the Jeep was fleeing the scene. I radioed this information and responded to that location, which was only a few blocks away.
When I arrived on scene, I located the Jeep, ALK-7937, pulled over on Chestnut St. near Main St. There were two individuals, identified by Wisconsin driver's licenses as Nicole Allen and standing outside the vehicle on the sidewalk. I activated my body camera and met with them. I asked them if someone got hit by a vehicle. Said she did and I observed said she did and I observed Said she was driving the Jeep that hit I asked if she needed an ambulance. Said she was unsure. I had dispatch page Southwest Health EMS to our location. I asked Nicole if she was injured. Nicole answered no.
I asked what happened. advised she was walking west on Main St. and crossed over Chestnut St. on the northside of the intersection. She stated she did not see the Jeep, which struck her shortly after entering the crosswalk. said she had her headphones in. I collected her current information. I had contact a friend to be with her.
I asked Nicole what happened. Nicole advised she was in the eastbound lane on Main St. at Chestnut St. She stated she was waiting for traffic, so she could turn left to go north on Chestnut St. Nicole said she turned left when it was clear and hit in the crosswalk. She advised she did not see and felt horrible about the situation. I collected Nicole's current information and insurance, Partners Mutual. I asked Nicole if her vehicle was damaged. Nicole stated no and the damage to the front bumper was old. I took pictures of the vehicle. Nicole provided me with a piece of paperwork with her contact information to give to which I later did.
When the ambulance arrived on scene, was checked out by the EMTs inside of it. I took pictures of her injures. The EMTs refused transport by EMS, but advised she would have her friend take her to Southwest Health Center (SWHC) for medical treatment. I told to let me know the extent of her injuries or drop off a copy of her discharge paperwork so I could document it for her. When friend arrived, she transported her to SWHC. A DT4000 was completed and both individuals were mailed copies of the driver's exchange of information report.



At approximately 3:37p.m. I was dispatched to Jewett St. at Hickory St., for a child that was struck by a vehicle on her bike. Arriving on scene, I activated my body camera. There was a child laying in the grass with the lead when she was hit, she was also wearing a helmet when the accident occurred. There was a female sitting next to her later identified as advised she was sitting in her chair at her house, which was located across the street on the Southeast corner of the intersection. When heard the crash, she looked out onto the road and the bike was moving across the road and the girl had landed in front of the vehicle. The provided here was at home when his mother, had informed him he needed to go to his sister because she had been struck by a vehicle. Since was only sixteen, I explained to him I needed to speak with a parent/guardian and asked where advised they lived just down the road on Westwood Ct. I asked if he could call the advised he had her phone and could not. When Ofc. Morell arrived on scene, I asked him to go speak with him. When Ofc. Morell arrived at gave EMS full permission to evaluate
The driver of the car was identified as Amber Mitchell. Amber advised she was traveling Southbound on Hickory St. when was traveling Westbound on Jewett St. had missed the stop sign. When missed the stop sign, Amber did not see until she was in front of the vehicle. Amber did not have time to react and struck Amber had one passenger in the vehicle, I took pictures of Amber's vehicle and documented what had happened. Amber was advised she could leave, but she needed to have some one else with a valid driver's license, drive the vehicle. Amber was informed she would be receiving a citation in the mail for operating while suspended.
A short time after EMS arrived on scene, had showed up along with was evaluated and not transported by EMS.
When I ran Amber's information after the incident, Amber was suspended with no license issued. Since there is not a license issued, Amber will be cited for operate w/o valid license (2nd offense), instead of being cited for operating while suspended.
On 5/20/2024, I called Amber and informed her she would be cited for operating w/o a license (2nd offense) and the court date on the top of the citation would be mandatory. I asked her if she could contact the owner of the vehicle to advised whether he has insurance or not on the vehicle. Since Amber said she was just driving the vehicle for that day for work, she did not know.
Amber was referred to the Grant Co. District Attorney's Office for operate w/o valid license (2nd offense within 3 years).
A DT4000 was filled out.
After the incident was referred to Grant Co. District Attorney's office. They emailed and aske to have medical records and a new citation issued to Amber for Operate w/out valid license- cause great bodily harm.
On 6/13/2024, I called to fill out a medical release form. Talking with she advised had a for a period of time after the accident. signed the medical release form and I sent it to Southwest Health records.

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On 6/17/2023, I mailed an updated citation and letter explaining the new citation to Amber.

Interview  I asked if she remembered what had happened. If she was coming from the Platteville middle school and heading home, traveling westbound. If said when she crossed the road, intersection of Jewett St. and Hickory St., she saw a black car in her peripheral vision. If did not know exactly the impact point of the car and did not know how the bike was hit from underneath her. If said she just remembers landing on her stomach with her hands out. She advised she braced herself, when landing, with her left side, mainly with her left wrist. If advised that if helmet was also cracked when they looked at it later on. I asked if how her she advised it did not hurt anymore. I asked if she remembered anything else before I had arrived on scene, she said she did not.  Was riding her bike on the sidewalk and had slowed down at the intersection of Jewett St. and Hickory St, she did not come to a stop at the stop sign. When she slowed down, if thought she had only looked to the left and not both ways. When was going through the intersection, she looked to her right, she then saw the car out of her peripheral vision.
Note: We were not called right away for the accident. When I had arrived on scene, and the bike had already been moved out of the road. Amber had already parked her car out of traffic to the North side of Jewett st. For this reason, there are no specific pictures of the accident scene as a whole.

On May 16, 2024, I, Officer Simeon Morell, was working as a uniformed police officer in the City of Platteville, County of Grant, State of Wisconsin.
At approximately 3:37pm, Officer Larissa Klemm was dispatched to a car vs. bicyclist traffic crash at the intersection of Hickory and Jewett St. Dispatch advised the driver of the striking vehicle had not wanted the complainant to call the police. I responded and arrived shortly after Officer Klemm. EMS was already responding for the bicyclist who was reported to be a young girl. On arrival, I saw the young girl was reclining on the sidewalk. She was later identified as to notify the mother, to notify the mother, of the crash. There was another juvenile on scene who was identified as a later identified as older brother. I learned from him that the mother was aware of the crash and he had been sent to the scene of the crash by his mother. She sent her cell phone with him so there was no way of calling the mother.
I drove to and knocked spoke with . She advised she was on a video call with her job and could not come to the crash at the moment. I asked her if she gave her permission to EMS to render any aid they deemed necessary and she said yes. I returned to the scene and relayed the medical consent to EMS who had arrived on scene. About 10 minutes later, returned to the scene with . I recognized Amber Mitchell, from prior police contacts. She told me she had been driving south on Hickory
Street. I recognized a who was with her as Amber said she was picking up from Westview Elementary School. As she was approaching the intersection with Jewett St, she saw a child cross the

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intersection on a bike in front of her. She slowed down and continued straight toward the intersection after the first child crossed. Suddenly, a second bicyclist, darted out into the intersection immediately in front of her car. She was unable to stop in time and struck the bicyclist.

Amber advised me the car she was driving, a Black Monte Carlo, with Wisconsin license plate ATW7092, belonged to Jerome Dyson. I knew he lived at the same address as Amber. She provided his contact information and advised she did not know if the car was insured. I have had previous contacts with Jerome driving while revoked in the Monte Carlo. He claimed to me the car belonged to the registered owner, Jaime Flores-Mendes.

Amber was suspended with no license issued. According to her driving record, she had previously been convicted for driving without a license in 2022
