Public Hearing

a. Local Designation – Rountree Stone Cottage: 460 W. Madison Street

An application and information has been submitted requesting the Rountree Stone Cottage property at 460 W. Madison be designated as a local historic site. The property is already listed on the State/National Register of Historic Places. Designated on the national register in 1972, state register in 1989, but not locally. The required process is for the Commission to hold a public hearing to consider the designation.

Riniker asked if they had approval from the Board to submit the nomination request. Graney replied that the Board did vote to submit the request. They are hoping to generate more interest and exposure for the property to increase the attendance. They also thought it was a logical request to have the property designated locally.

Graney provided a statement regarding the request and additional information on the history of the property.

A statement in favor of the request was made by Terry Burns. She is also on the Historical Society Board.

There were no other public statements.

Hi Joe. Your application looks pretty good. The first two properties you propose for nomination to the National Register - the Armory and the Steuhl house - are good to go. The other two are problematic - both of them have notes in our database that say, "not eligible." That means that at some point our office evaluated these properties for NR eligibility and determined that they were not eligible at that time we evaluated them. Neither of them is mentioned in the 2005 survey.

In the case of 560 N. Court St., it's likely that it doesn't rise above the many other Queen Anne style houses in Platteville to be exceptional. In the case of 790 S. Court St., it looks like the house has some significant integrity issues - that it has had some extensive alterations to windows, roofing, siding, etc. It looks very old so these kinds of alterations are expected, but it looks like the replacement materials are more modern and don't replicate what would have bene on the house when it was built.

I can tell you that we won't award grant funding for nominations for properties that don't appear eligible. And we won't award CLG grant funding for property research. My advice is to remove 560 N. Court St. and 790 S. Court St. from your application and submit for funding to nominate the other two properties - I'd say \$7-\$8K per nomination. Remember that you can use grant funding to subscribe to our database (\$750/yr. for local governments), and also for any staff time devoted to grant application, review, and project management

If you want to amend your application, you wouldn't need to resubmit everything again. Just let me know what you want to change and I'll amend what you've already submitted.
