Plastic containers



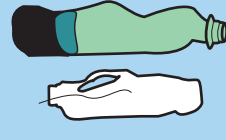
Collect by recycling code

Rinse

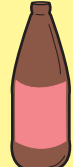


No need to remove labels

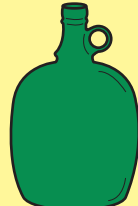
Separate colors (if required)

No dishes or glasses

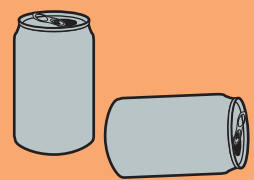

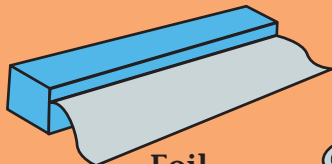

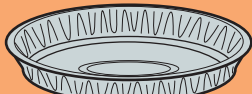
Aluminum

Mixed paper and newspaper

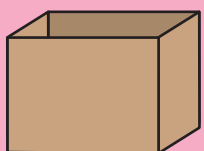


Bundle and tie newspaper



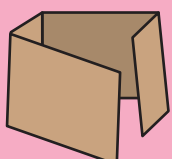
Place in recycling bin or cart

Look for the ribbed, wavy layer.

Flatten the cardboard
