This exempt position performs a variety of supervisory, administrative, skilled, technical, and maintenance work in the planning, construction, operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of city water and sewer facilities and systems. The minimum starting salary is \$67,000—\$75,000, commensurate with experience. Our Community

Located in scenic southwest Wisconsin, Platteville is home to over 11,000 residents, including a large student population. Platteville is part of Wisconsin's Driftless Area and is surrounded by rolling hills and beautiful farm country. While Platteville started as a lead and zinc mining center, today the area economy revolves around agriculture and manufacturing. The city has a his-

toric Main Street and extensive retail opportunities, both downtown and near the east-side expressway exit. Platte-ville is the home of University of Wisconsin-Platteville, which serves over 7,000 students with on-campus and distance learning programs.

Platteville has excellent medical facilities, a bustling industry park, and several quickly developing housing areas.

Residents and visitors enjoy 16 city parks, which include





over 200 acres of open space, city museums, art gallery, playgrounds, baseball and softball diamonds, biking and hiking trails, a skate park, picnic shelters, an arboretum, and an outdoor aquatics center. New community amenities include a new 22,000 square foot public library, 6,000 square foot event center, an inclusive playground and the Rountree Branch Trail, a paved and lighted trail for bicyclists and walkers. Platteville Public Schools consistently receive high ratings. In addition, area residents benefit from the many educational, athletic and cultural events offered at UW-Platteville.

City Government

The City of Platteville has a City Manager form of government. Platteville's Common Council has seven members; three of the members have served for over fifteen years and bring a wealth of knowledge to their role. Leadership team members include the City Manager, Public Works Director, Administration Director, Community Development Director, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Parks & Recreation Director, Library Director and Museum Director. Having a supportive and cooperative working relationship is of high importance to the members of the leadership team. 77 regular full-time and part-time employees work at the City. Volunteer firefighters and seasonal employees round out the rest of our team.

Utility Superintendent

Essential Functions Include:

- Plans, schedules and implements construction, maintenance, and operation and construction activities designed to provide quality water and sewer service for the city; oversees construction and maintenance work to determine acceptability and conformance to standards.
- Supervises the control and use of, and assumes responsibility for all materials, supplies and equipment used in the maintenance, construction and repair of water systems, sewer collection, and other department facilities.
- Inspects and supervises the repair of water and wastewater treatment equipment,
 booster pumping stations, reservoir, towers, meters, and sewer system at frequent intervals to ensure that all aspects of the systems are functioning properly.
- Supervises, instructs and assists as needed, assigned crews in installing new water and sewer lines, installing and relocating fire hydrants and meters, and maintaining the existing water supply, distribution, and sewer collection systems.
- Responds to complaints regarding water leaks, pressure loss or no water, and sewer
 problems; evaluates situation, determines if liability lies with the city or the property
 owner; explains findings to property owners and notifies appropriate water and sewer
 crew if necessary.
- Oversees the safety of assigned maintenance workers and equipment operators by instructing individuals in proper safety procedures and monitoring work in progress.
- Responds to emergency situations (water breaks, plugged sewers) as required.
- Operates Water Plant in the absence of other licensed personnel when necessary.
- Adheres and complies with DNR regulations.
- Trains, supervises and disciplines employees performing the duties of maintenance, construction and repair of water and sewer facilities.

Candidate Qualifications/Certifications

- Minimum 5 years' related experience
- High School diploma or GED equivalent
- Ability to manage several projects simultaneously while maintaining high attention to details
- Ability to support a culture of engagement and transparency by involving employees,
 elected officials and residents into decision-making processes.
- Waterworks Operator Certifications
 - * Grade 1 GD water exam (required upon hire)
 - * Grade 1 GDI water exam (required to complete within 18 months of hire)
- Wastewater Operator Certifications
 - * Basic Sewer exam + at least one subclass—A1, A2, B, C, P, D, L, or SS (required upon hire) (completion of remaining subclasses will be required within 18 months of hire)
 - * Advanced sewer exam with subclasses A1, A2, B, C, P, D, L (within 36 months of hire)
- Continuing education to maintain certifications will be required and will be recommended to be in the areas of water and sewer lab courses, operational courses and math courses.
