WATER & SEWER COMMISSION MINUTES WEDNESDAY, February 14th, 2024 4:00 PM

Water and Sewer Commission President Martens called the Regular Meeting of the City of Platteville Water and Sewer Commission to order on Wednesday, February 14th at 4:01 pm.

Citizens' Comments -

The Consent Agenda was presented for consideration. **Motion by Daus, second by Kopp to approve the Consent Agenda**: January 10th, 2024 Regular Minutes, January 2024 Financial Reports, January Bank Reconciliation & Investments Reports, Payment of Bills (1/4/2024-2/7/2024), January Water Quality Report. **Motion carried.**

ACTION ITEMS:

Replace Backhoe at Wastewater Plant – Crofoot presented the request for a budget amendment for the replacement of the backhoe. This CIP item was omitted when creating the CIP plan for 2024. Staff is recommending that the unspent funds from the Wastewater Plant Office Boiler project, the McGregor Plaza Sewer Replacement and up to \$22,000 in cash reserves be used to purchase the 2018 backhoe.

Motion made by Daus, second by Kopp to approve Budget Amendment 1 to request the carryover and use of unspent funds from the Wastewater Plant Office Boiler project, the McGregor Plaza Sewer Replacement project and up to \$22,000 in cash reserves for a 2018 backhoe and approve the sale/trade-in of the 1991 backhoe. Motion carried.

LSL Replacement Loan Program – Crofoot presented the 3 options for the LSL Replacement Loan Program.

Option 1: Non-Utility Fund Pledge

Option 2: Water Utility Fund Pledge

Option 3: Alternative Revenue Pledge

Motion made by Daus, second by Kopp to recommend that the Common Council adopt Option 3, Alternative Revenue Pledge for the Lead Service Line Replacement Program and that the Council enact enabling Ordinances to allow for the establishment of an LSL utility and Special Charge on the tax roll for private-side property owner loan repayments. Motion carried.

Award Contract 24-23, Sand Filter Upgrades – Crofoot presented the bids received for Contract 24-23, Sand Filter Upgrades. Sabel Mechanical was the lowest bidder for the Base Bid only, but Winona Mechanical Inc was the lowest bidder overall with the Base Bid plus the Bid Alternate.

Motion made by Kilian, second by Daus to award Contract 24-23, Sand Filter Upgrades to Winona Mechanical for Base Bid and Alternate Bid for \$781,457 and direct Staff to budget for 2025 costs in the 2025 CIP. Motion carried.

Description: This is for water, sanitary sewer, storm sewer and street reconstruction of West Adams Street from Chestnut to Court Street. It is to support the new Fire Facility being built there. When the budget was originally discussed, the project did not include acquisition of the property to the west and access directly at the Adams – Chestnut intersection. The designers are recommending that the water and sewer services come off W. Adams Street instead of Lewis Street as before. This will increase Water & Sewer costs to extend sanitary sewer further east by about 50 feet, plus the cost of installing service laterals and water services to the lot line.

The Alternate Bid is for replacing the sanitary sewer on North Court Street south of Adams Street. This section of sanitary sewer is in very poor condition. If budget allows, staff recommends replacing the sewer in conjunction with this project.

There were 5 bidders, with Bill Lepke as a new bidder for Platteville. This was our low bidder. Delta 3 has done reference checks. In 2022 they did projects for Reedsburg and New Lisbon. The Reedsburg project budget was approximately the same as ours at \$313,000. In 2023 the firm did a project for Baraboo for \$711,000. The full bid tabulation is attached.

Budget/Fiscal Impact: The budget is \$310,000, of this, \$135,000 is budgeted from Water and Sewer. The Engineering costs are \$30,000 leaving \$280,000 available for construction. The low Base Bid is \$327,600.92 for a shortfall of \$47,600.92. The Alternate bid is \$33,167.90. The overage is attributed to changes in the Fire Facility project and are split \$47,519.10 City and \$81,82 to water and sewer. The Water and Sewer allocation of project costs and engineering for the Base Bid only is over budget by \$81.82.

Staff recommends this amount be absorbed in the budget

Recommendation: Staff recommends awarding Contract 2-24, West Adams Street Reconstruction water and sewer portion to Bill Lepke at the Bid Price of \$120,081.82. Over budget in the amount of \$81.82 is to be absorbed in the budget.

On Thursday, February 29, 204, bids were received for the W. Adams Street Reconstruction project, Contract #2-24. A total of five bids were received, opened, and publicly read aloud for the project, which consisted of a single base bid plus one alternate. The "as-read" and confirmed low bidder was Bill Lepke Excavating with a bid submission of the following:

Base Bid: \$327,600.92 <u>Alternate #2-24A:</u> \$33,167.90 Total: \$360,768.82

The final bid tabulation with all received bids has been attached for your review.

Contract #2-24 is the full reconstruction of W. Adams Street from N. Chestnut Street to N. Court Street. It includes replacing the water main and sanitary sewer as well as replacing the street. It includes widening out the street on the north side to accommodate the future fire station and the installation of PCC pavement (concrete pavement) in the intersection of W. Adams Street and N. Chestnut Street. The installation of PCC pavement in this intersection will extend the life of this section of street since there are going to be heavy trucks entering and exiting the intersection from the future fire station.

Alternate #2-24A is the replacement of 90 feet of sanitary sewer on N. Court Street, south of W. Adams Street. Currently the manhole that is located south of W. Adams Street is in extremely poor condition and this alternate will include replacing it as well as the sanitary sewer between it and W. Adams. The manhole will also be moved north, closer to W. Adams Street, to minimize the footage of sanitary sewer piping.

This project is scheduled to be started after Memorial Day and be completed before Labor Day. The installation of PCC pavement in the intersection of W. Adams Street and N. Chestnut Street will require a full street closure for approximately two weeks. Elm Street will be a detour route during this closure and by having the project completed in the summer, there will be less traffic since the Platteville public schools and UW-Platteville will not be in session.

Bill Lepke Excavating is a new contractor for the City of Platteville. We have contacted the references that they have provided, and their references indicated that the work completed has been satisfactory and they would be allowed to bid on future projects. Two of the three projects

provided were similar in scope and size to the West Adams Street project. We also contacted their subcontractors, and their subcontractors indicated no issues with scheduling or payment.

Due to budget constraints, there is not sufficient funding for Alternate #2-24A. Therefore, we would recommend awarding only the base bid to Bill Lepke Excavating in the amount of \$327,600.92.

Description: This project is to replace water and sewer on Camp Street between Elm and Lancaster. There is a follow up project by the DOT to reconstruct storm sewer and street in 2025.

We opened 5 bids on March 7. The bid tabulation is enclosed. The Base Bid includes using asphalt to patch the trenches for water and sewer construction. Alternate A is to use a chip seal as a low cost alternative for approximately 9 months. The low bidder for Base Bid and Alternate A is Rule Construction out of Dodgeville with a bid of \$499,216.00. The contractor has done work for the City before, most recently the Dewey Street project in 2022.

Budget/Fiscal Impact: The combined budget is \$595,000. Deduct the Engineering costs of \$80,000 and you get \$515,000 for construction costs. The low bid, including Alternate A was \$499,216.00. We are under budget.

Recommendation: Staff recommends awarding Contract 3-24 with Alternate A, Camp Street Water & Sewer Replacement to Rule Construction at the bid price of \$499,216.00.

On Thursday, March 7, 2024, bids were received for the Camp Street Water and Sewer project, Contract #3-24. A total of five bids were received, opened, and publicly read aloud for the project, which consisted of a single base bid plus one alternate. The "as-read" and confirmed low bidder was Rule Construction, Ltd. of Dodgeville, Wisconsin with a bid submission of the following:

Base Bid: \$520,349.00 <u>Alternate #3-24A: -\$ 21,133.00</u> Total: \$499,216.00

The final bid tabulation with all received bids has been attached for your review.

Contract #3-24 is the replacement of the water main and sanitary sewer on Camp Street from Lancaster Street to Elm Street. The water main and sanitary sewer, including water services and sewer laterals, will be replaced in 2024 while the street will be fully reconstructed in 2025 as part of a Wisconsin Department of Transportation project currently in the design phase. The base bid includes patching the street with HMA (asphalt) pavement.

Alternate #3-24A is a reduction in the bid price to chip seal (aka seal coat) the water main and sanitary sewer trenches on Camp Street instead of patching them with HMA pavement. Chip sealing is routinely completed on township roads. The reasoning behind this alternate bid is that in 2025 when the street is fully reconstructed, all of the HMA pavement patching completed as part of this project will be removed and either placed in a fill site or possibly recycled (depending on the contractor requirements of the 2025 project). The chip seal only needs to last from September 2024 to May 2025, essentially 9 months, until the street reconstruction project begins.

This project will begin in late May or early June, shortly after the Platteville public schools and UW-Platteville spring semesters have ended and will be completed before Labor Day. Work is required to be completed in the Lancaster Street (STH "81") and Camp Street intersection. Lancaster Street will be required to remain open to traffic at all times, but will be reduced to one lane of traffic while work is completed in that intersection. The remainder of Camp Street will be closed to through traffic during the project.

Rule Construction has successfully completed several projects for the City of Platteville over the past twenty years. Most recently they completed the Cedar Street project in 2022, which was a

full street and utility reconstruction project. There were no issues with Rule Construction on that project nor have there been any issues with Rule Construction in the past.

The construction budget for this project is \$515,000. The base bid with the alternate is \$499,216.00, approximately \$15,000 under budget. Therefore, we recommend that Contract #3-24 with Alternate #3-24A be awarded to Rule Construction, Ltd.
